- My parents get mad when they have to ask me multiple times



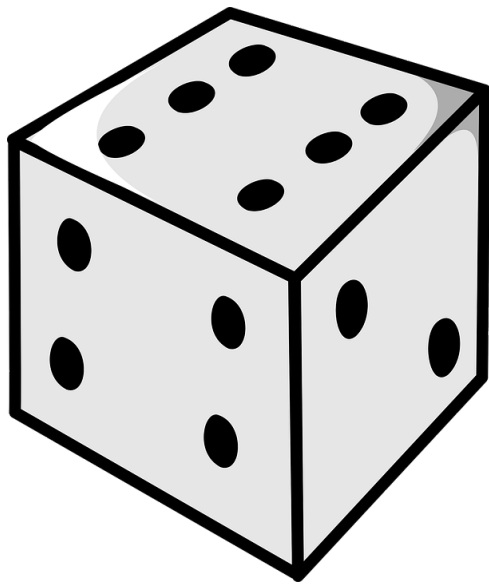
Main Questions

- What bias was this? Social Desirability Bias

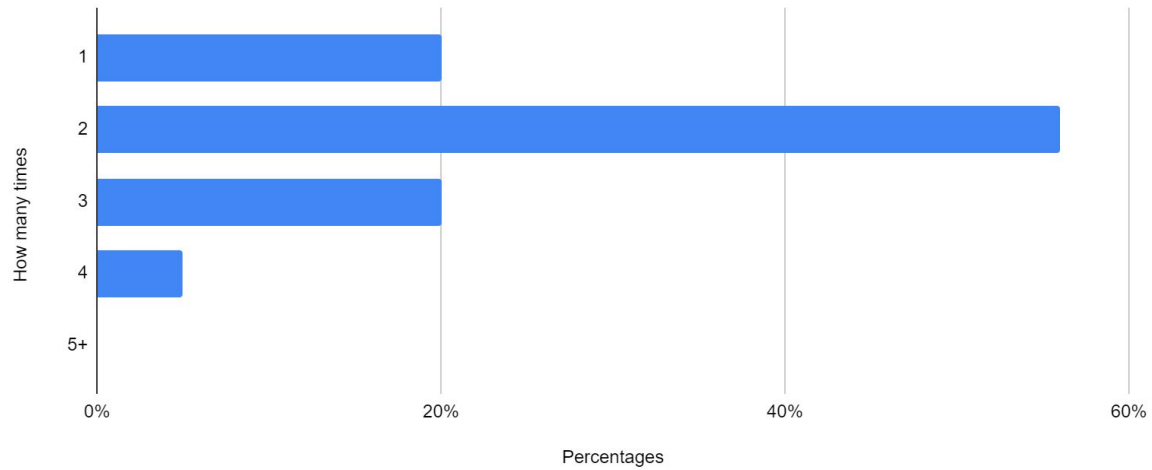


How did you collect the data? (Continued)

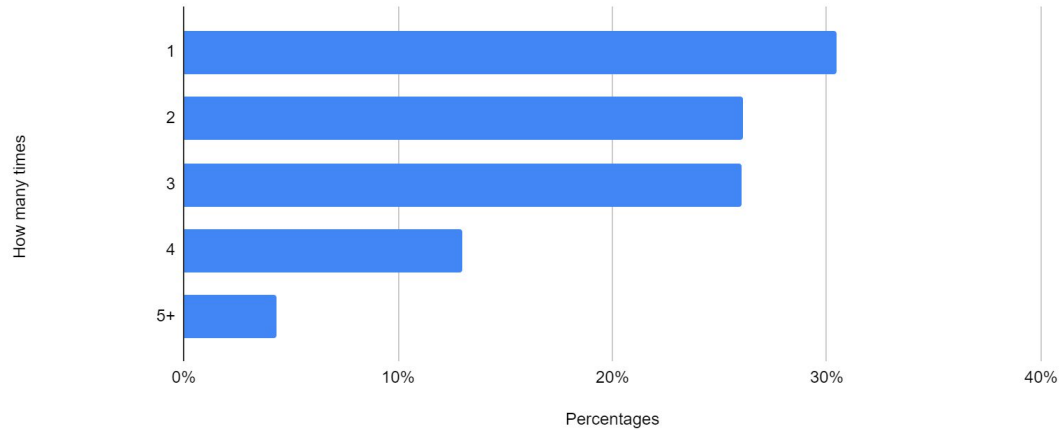
- Randomly selected 25 students and sent them a survey with two questions

- It's a matter of seeing if people will be more truthful in person



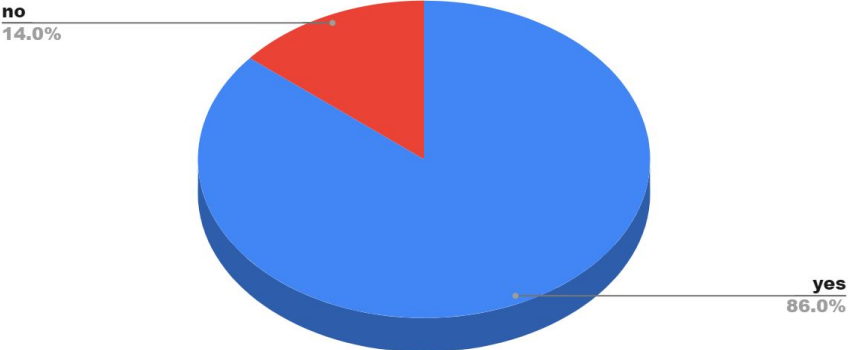
How many times do your parents have to ask you? (25, Person)



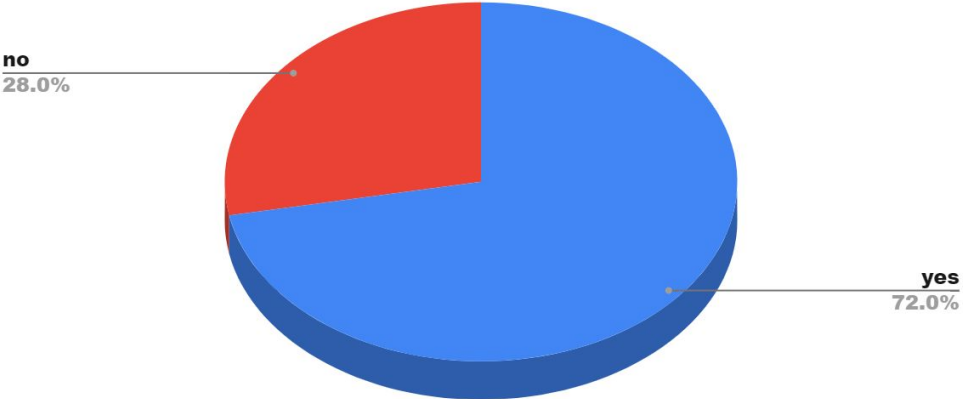
How many times do your parents have to ask you? (25, Survey)
